ICS and Commo Exercise With Squad Mobilization

(GR Final 14 July)

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Exercise Objectives:

- 1. Evaluate members for mobilization **sign-in** and use of initial area survey.
- 2. Test procedures for **communication** among CP staff sections and with squads at incident scenes. Conduct radio test over entire Seacliff area.
- 3. Practice procedures for the CERT Incident Command Group to **assign** tasks to a squad, document, and follow through to conclusion.
- 4. Practice procedures for a squad to **document** needs and actions before, during, and after an assigned task.
- 5. Practice Command Post procedures to delegate and perform the **functions** of each staff position, including documentation.
- 6. Review a squad's capability to perform **sizeup** procedures in different tasks, including utility shutoff and request for additional equipment.
- 7. Maintain **safe** conditions, especially during squad travel to incident sites. CERT teams will not enter private property at any time for this exercise.

Scenario:

A major (7.4 on the Richter Scale) earthquake on the San Andreas Fault strikes Northern California at 8:40 AM on Saturday July 17, 2016. The shaking affects the entire San Francisco Bay and Monterey Bay Areas, including our own Seacliff area. The weather is mild and overcast, with little wind.

Several stores at Rancho Del Mar Shopping Center are currently engulfed in flames and fire trucks from all Aptos-La Selva Fire Stations are fully engaged with that operation. Both mobile and land phone lines are disabled, although there is some success with sending text messages. A volunteer HAM radio operator has arrived at the Aptos Fire Station and is ready to make contact with CERT teams.

There is no electrical power in the Seacliff area. Water pressure still exists in some neighborhoods. Many homes have sustained various degrees of damage and some fires have started. There have been reports of utility damage.

Sequence of events:

0845 radio call to "activate" squads

0900 squads radio or on-scene sign in

0915 CP organized; tasks given to squads; additional messages begin

Squads go out to specified neighborhood locations and report

1025 squads and command post people switch

1035 CP reorganized; tasks given to squads; additional messages begin

New squads go out to similar neighborhood locations and report

1145 gather for After Action review (and sign-out)

1200 exercise complete; BBQ at Mary's

Duties of Observers:

Your role will be to facilitate and coach, as well as acting as site Safety Officer.

- Facilitate by providing preplanned messages that require action.
- Observe to ensure appropriate actions, especially continuing size-up.
- Coach squad sizeup and actions when necessary to reinforce correct procedures.
- Take notes on decisions and actions so you can use them in the After Action Review.
- Insure that everyone maintains a watchful safety, especially when crossing streets.

After Action Review may include:

- Summary of Objectives (from Exercise Plan)
- Number of Participants (from Sign-In Sheets)
- Exercise Events Synopsis
- Analysis of Critical Task Performance
- Discussion of Lessons Learned
- Distribution of Participation Certificates

House 1: (508 Harriet St)

[electric hazard; structure damaged; road access)

One car in the driveway.

Several windows are broken and there is glass on the ground around the house.

A detached power line is hanging down the side of the house.

Books have fallen off of the book shelves, pictures off walls, and there is broken glass on floor.

House 2: (517 Harriet St)

[structure damaged; people injured; road access] Two cars in driveway and toys in front yard. Chimney has collapsed and bricks on roof and ground. There are fallen shelves inside, and suspended ceiling has collapsed. Yelling from someone inside the house.

House 3: (510 Spruce St)

[structure damaged; people injured & trapped; road access] Window shutters knocked off; visible cracks in outer wall surface Woman outside house is screaming that her son is trapped under debris in house and she can't find her 3-year-old daughter.

House 4: (515 Spruce St)

[burning; chemical; injured; trapped; access]

building has only minor damage but Smoke coming from the rear

NFPA díamond on garage: Red – 3, Yellow – 1, Blue - 1

People wandering around outside the house with a variety of injuries, shouting for help and saying that there are people trapped inside.

Some casualties have already been removed from building or assisted in evacuation.
